PREFACE

- The enclosed list of historical and general interest articles, tables, maps, photographs etc has been compiled from complete sets of the English Almanacs or Yearbooks of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Australia (E.L.C.A.) from 1918 – 1966, United Evangelical Lutheran Church in Australia (U.E.L.C.A.) from 1920 – 1966 and the Lutheran Church of Australia (L.C.A.) since 1967.
- Upper and lower case printing and punctuations for article headings have been included as published. Some headings in lower case are generalised headings only.
- Many of the larger articles have a large number of sub-headings on a diverse range of subjects within the topic of the article. This summary only includes the headings of each article.
- A number of comments have been included in brackets to assist in explaining the subject matter of the article, or whether the article or table has been repeated from previous years.
- Some photos have been listed of deceased Pastors, lay persons and personnel who lost their life in World War II.
- The names of authors have been included where published. In many instances, only initials have been identified and these generally have not been included in this summary. In some cases, the status of the author has also been included in brackets eg Pastor, Dr. etc.
- Reference has been made in brackets in those articles that included a Bibliography or a list of sources of information in preparing the particular article.
- Church Directory information has not been included (as it is the primary reason for the publication) but statistical annual summaries of the respective Synods have been listed where published.
- Other regular features published that have not been included in this summary are:
 - devotional articles unless they contain some historical content
 - lists of church festivals, public holidays etc.
 - fictional articles, short stories, poems, puzzles etc
 - postal and wireless information, lists of Post Offices etc
 - household hints, tables and summaries of interest to farmers,
 - first aid advice, gardening information etc
 - directions for making a will
 - advertisements
- Many of the larger articles over the years have been very thoroughly researched and perhaps could be reprinted in booklet form (with permission if required) by an organisation of the Church eg FOLA to make the information more accessible to the general public.

- The list of articles is not necessarily complete as others may assess that some of the articles included in this summary could have been omitted or others included.
